# PM's 5-day tour of South-East Asia to help consolidate defence, space ties

rime Minister Narendra Modi on Tuesclay embarked on a five-day visit toInclonesia, Malaysia and Singapore to consolidate India's ties with three important strategic partners in the South-East Asia region. Ite is expected to sign key agreements in the areas of defence and space.

Modi'sfirststop will be Indonesia - the largest country in the region and a close marilime neighbour. According to estimates, the shortest distance between India's Andaman Istands and Indonesia's Aceh province is not more than 80

nautical miles. Indian naval ships make regular visits to Indonesian ports and joint patrolling of the seas has been going on for some years now.

A key highlight of the visit could be an agreement that
allows India access to the strategic island of Sabang at the northen tip of Sumatra and close to the MalaccaStrait. That Indonesia could sive India access to the island was indicated in a recent speech in New Delhi by the coordinating minisfer for maritime affairs of Indonesia, Luhut Pandjaitan.

India is looking to invest in theportand the economiczone here and, if this agreement is clinched during Modi's current visit, it will give Delhia foothold in the region. It will come as a shot in the arm for the National Democratic Alliance government's'Acteast policy. Sucha foothold in the region is also expected to offergreaterscope for the country toraise its profilein the Indo-Pacific region.
