## Swaminathan Panel Report Being Implemented: Minister

New Delhi: The government is implementing the Swaminathancommission reportfor improvinglivingstandards of farmers and upliftment of farmsector, said agricultureminister Radha Mohan Singh. In order to implement policy reforms and new schemes in agriculture, in the past few years, the government has taken several measures and a budgetary provision of ₹ $2,11,694$ crore has been made, he added.

National Commission on Farmers (NCF) presiden Swaminathan had advised the then government, in his report in 2006, that proper at tention should be given to the welfare of farmersalong with welfareof farmersalong thinking, Singh said. "The NCF had made a number of recommendations for enhancing the income of farmers. Keeping them in mind, the government has implemented alot of reformatory schemes," Singh added. The government has intro duced the Model Agricultural Land Leasing Act, 2016 to all states which is a very impor tant step in agricultural re forms, said Singh. "The interests of both-the land holders and therecipientof theleaseare protected. The implemen tation of market reforms has led to enhancement of transparency in the market. The e-

NAM scheme links agriculture markets across the country." Apart from 585 mandis of the country, the government has set up National Agricultural Market. It is focusing on open trade between the mandis and there are 22,000 rural markets across the country through which small farmers will be able to sell their produce in an effective way, said Singh.
Keeping in view the recommendations of the NCF to increase productivity and eliminate malnutrition, 795 improved varieties of crops have been developed in the last four years by ICAR out of which 495 varieties are tolerant to climate change, said Singh. "These have been handed over to farmer so that they can take advantage of the advanced varieties."

Establishing thenationwide soil healthcar schemeis an important aspect of this thought," said Singh Apart from this, the government has created corpus funds for improving the infrastructure for dairy, cooperative, fisheries and aquaculture, animal husbandry, agriculture market and micro irrigation. "The government has adopted an inco me-oriented approach towards sustainable production kee ping in mind the welfare of agriculture, farmers and the consumers," saidSingh.
