## Lok Sabha to simplify <br> gives nod GST laws

NEW DELH: The Lok Sabha on Thursday passedfour bills, seeking amendment to GST laws, including simplification of the returnfiling process andincreasing the upper limitofturnoverfor opting for composition scheme from Rs 1 crore to Rs 1.5 crore.

The Central GST (Amendment) Bill, Integrated GST (Amendment) Bill, Union Territory GST (Amendment) Bill and GST (Compensation to States) Amendment Bill were tabled in the lower House of the Parliamenton Tuesday.

UnionfinanceministerPiyush Goyal said the Centre was making all efforts to simplify procedures and rationalise the Goods and Services Tax (GST) rates to create a "good and simple tax regime, as envisioned by Prime

Minister Narendra Modi".
He said the GST Council has reduced GST rates on 384 items and 68 services in the last one year, and as complianceandrevenuecollectionincreases, tax rate on more goods and services will be slashed.

Goyal said, acknowledging the need to simplify the returnfiling process, a committee was set up to study return forms, which came up with a single-page return. "Ithasnow beenplacedin thepublic domain for wider consultation," he added.
"Small traders were worried about thereversecharge mechanism, so we decided to make appropriatechanges in thelaw... We also deferredit by 15 months to September 2019," said theminister.
