operationandeconomictieswith the country. Syria, on its part, has been against a strong anti-India position on Kashmir in the Organisation of Islamic Cooperation (OIC). Some other Arab League member states, which are also OIC members, have also favoured a similar position on the Kashmirissue.
Since2015, Indiahas beenengaging more intensely with the Arab World, with the Prime Minister and external affairsminister undertaking several visits to the region and hosting its leaders including the Abu Dhabi Crown Prince at the 2017 Republic Day celebrations. Modi, preceded by the then President Pranab Mukherjee, also visited Palestine, thefirst Indian PM todo so.
While India de-hyphenated ties with Israel and the Arab World, with Modibecoming thefirst Indian PM to visit Israel and later hosting PM Benjamin Netanyahu within six months of his visit, the country also elevated ties with the UAE, Saudi Arabia, Oman, Bahrain and Jordan to the next level. Modi's recentmeeting with the Crown Prince of Saudi Arabia led to a decision on the part of Saudi Arabia to scale up investments in India.
