# Rajnath inaugurates laser fencing along IB in Jammu

### 'Will Make Our Borders Foolproof'

Jammu: Union home minister Rajnath Singh inaugurated a stretch of laser fence along the International Border in Jammu on Monday.

The pilot project—part of the Comprehensive Integrated Border Management System (CIBMS) — meant to provide round-the-clock surveillance on the border, will use thermal imager, underground sensors, fiber optical sensors, radar and sonar technologies to make "vulnerable stretches of the IB fool proof". It includes deploying laser-activated fences and technology-enabled barriers to plug vulnerable gaps along frontiers.

"Once this project completed it will cover around 2,026 kilometres of area identified as vulnerable and the pilot project will also be further enhanced and improved," he said.
