SURGEON VICE ADMIRAL INDERJIT SINGH
TAKES OVER AS
DIRECTOR GENERAL ARMED FORCES MEDICAL SERVICES

Surgeon Vice Admiral Inderjit Singh has taken over as the Director General Armed Forces Medical Services (DG AFMS) at New Delhi. He was earlier the Command Medical Officer at the Headquarters of Western Naval Command.

Vice Admiral Inderjit Singh graduated from Medical College Amritsar in 1958 and was commissioned into the Army Medical Corps the following year. Having specialised in Pathology, he obtained Diploma in Clinical Pathology from AFMC and later obtained MD in Pathology and Bacteriology from KGMU Lucknow. He was permanently seconded to Indian Navy in 1989.

During his 35 years of service career so far, both in Army and Navy, he has commanded Military Hospital and held the post of Director Medical Services and Director Institute of Naval Medicine. He has commanded a 800 bedded referral Naval Hospital undertaking renal transplant, joint replacement, Onco-surgery and HIV screening.
