CLARIFICATION ON DEMONETISED COINS

It has been brought to the notice of the Government of India that owing to some misunderstanding of the position, some difficulty has been felt in distinguishing the rupee, half rupee and quarter rupee coins made of quaternary alloy (containing Silver), which have been demonstised recently, from similar nickel coins which tontinue to be legal tender. It is hereby darified that the rupee, half rupee and quarter rupee coins in quaternary alloy which have recently been demonstised were circular in shape, were minted up to the middle of 1946 and bore the King's effigy on one side and a circular floral design on the other. Though these coins are no more legal tender they will be accepted at all offices and agency and subgagency banks of the Reserve Bank of India conducting Government business and at all Government treasuries and sub-treasuries as well as post and telegraph and railway offices for payment of dues till September 30, 1968 and at the issue offices of the Reserve Bank of India until further notice.

The other rupse half rupse and quarter rupse coins in <u>nickel</u>, which were minted from the middle of 1946 onwards and bear the King's effigy on one side and the figure of tiger on the other, as well as <u>all</u> rupse, half rupse and quarter rupse coins with the Asoka Pillar and Nehru coins continue to be legal tender, and should be accepted by all.
