

J&K Dy CM highlights Modi govt's achievements

Says time required to obtain desired results of policies

To mark the three-year completion of the NDA government at the Centre, Jammu & Kashmir Deputy Chief Minister Nirmal Singh today visited Patiala to highlight the achievements of the Modi government.

While promoting the policies of the Modi government, Singh said they were trying to implicate better policies on the ground and it would take some time to obtain the desired results.

While replying to a query on farmers' protest, he said, "The farming community is being neglected for the last 60 years. It will take some to bring the change for farmers." Singh also attacked all other counterparts from Pakistan to the previous regime of Manmohan Singh.

While talking about the Kashmir unrest, the Deputy CM said, "We have brought the situation under control and as it a proxy war, the terrorists are being supported by our neighboring country. The security forces have killed 38 militants in the last month, which proves the capability of the government."

Tight security in place for Amarnath Yatra

While inviting pilgrims for the Amarnath Yatra from Punjab, the Deputy CM claimed that they have deployed additional forces on the yatra route for better security of pilgrims visiting the shrine.

"We have demanded a full battalion to maintain security in south Kashmir. We are committed to deliver our best for the safety of pilgrims and we invite people from across the nation to pay homage at Amarnath," Nirmal Singh said.
