SC to go paperless post vacation

NEW DELHI, MAY 10

When the Supreme Court opens after summer vacation, it will be a digital Supreme Court where use of paper would be a thing of the past.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Wednesday inaugurated the Supreme Court's Integrated Case Management Information System which heralds a digital revolution in the judiciary. Modi asked those in the judiciary to change their mindset and adopt digital technology.

Chief Justice of India JS Khehar announced that the Supreme Court Registry would start functioning as a digital court when it reopens after the summer vacation in the first week of July.

free system which would work to benefit lawyers and litigants alike and would make things easier for judges as well, the CJI said. "It will help litigants to file only one case and the same will be transferred to higher courts automatically due to digitisation of documents."

Justice Khehar had on March 23 said that in six to seven months the practice of transparency, ease the working system and to reduce backlog of cases, digitisation is very much required.
